Sermon Scriptures

<u>Acts 2:31</u> he looked ahead and spoke of **the resurrection of the Christ**, that HE WAS NEITHER ABANDONED TO HADES, **NOR DID His flesh SUFFER DECAY**.

Matt. 28:1-8 1 ¶ Now after the Sabbath, as it began to dawn toward the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary came to look at the grave. 2 And behold, a severe earthquake had occurred, for an angel of the Lord descended from heaven and came and rolled away the stone and sat upon it. 3 And his appearance was like lightning, and his clothing as white as snow. 4 The guards shook for fear of him and became like dead men. 5 The angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid; for I know that you are looking for Jesus who has been crucified. 6 "He is not here, for He has risen, just as He said. Come, see the place where He was lying. 7 "Go quickly and tell His disciples that He has risen from the dead; and behold, He is going ahead of you into Galilee, there you will see Him; behold, I have told you." 8 ¶ And they left the tomb quickly with fear and great joy and ran to report it to His disciples.

<u>Mark 16:2</u> Very early on the first day of the week, they came to the tomb when the sun had risen.

<u>1 Cor. 15:3, 4</u> ¶ For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received, that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, $\underline{4}$ and that He was buried, and that He was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures,

<u>Matt. 16:21</u> ¶ From that time **Jesus began to show His disciples** that He must go to Jerusalem, and suffer many things from the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and **be raised up on the third day**.

Rom. 1:3, 4 3 concerning His Son, who was born of a descendant of David according to the flesh, 4 who was declared the Son of God with power by the resurrection from the dead, according to the Spirit of holiness, Jesus Christ our Lord,

Acts 1:1-3 1 ¶ The first account I composed, Theophilus, about all that Jesus began to do and teach, 2 until the day when He was taken up *to heaven*, after He had by the Holy Spirit given orders to the apostles whom He had chosen. 3 To these He also **presented Himself alive after His suffering, by many convincing proofs**, appearing to them over *a period of* forty days and speaking of the things concerning the kingdom of God.

<u>1 Cor. 15:5, 7</u> and that He appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. <u>7</u> then He appeared to James, then to all the apostles;

<u>1 Cor. 15:6</u> After that He appeared to more than five hundred brethren at one time, most of whom remain until now, but some have fallen asleep;

<u>John 6:44</u> "No one can come to Me unless the Father who sent Me draws him; and I will raise him up on the last day.

<u>1 Cor. 15:8, 9</u> and last of all, as to one untimely born, **He appeared to me also**. <u>9</u> For I am the **least of the apostles**, and **not fit** to be called **an apostle**, because I persecuted the church of God.

Acts 9:1-9 1 ¶ Now Saul, still breathing threats and murder against the disciples 2 and asked for letters from him to the synagogues of the Lord, went to the high priest, at Damascus, so that if he found any belonging to the Way, both men and women, he might bring them bound to Jerusalem. 3 As he was traveling, it happened that he was approaching Damascus, and suddenly a light from heaven flashed around him; Acts 9:4 and he fell to the ground and heard a voice saying to him, "Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting Me?" 5 And he said, "Who are You, Lord?" And He said, "I am Jesus whom you are persecuting, 6 but get up and enter the city, and it will be told you what you must do." 7 The men who traveled with him stood speechless, hearing 8 Saul got up from the ground, and though his eyes were the voice but seeing no one. open, he could see nothing; and leading him by the hand, they brought him into Damascus. 9 And he was three days without sight, and neither ate nor drank.

Acts 9:10-16 10 ¶ Now there was a disciple at Damascus named Ananias; and the Lord said to him in a vision, "Ananias." And he said, "Here I am, Lord." 11 And the Lord said to him, "Get up and go to the street called Straight, and inquire at the house of Judas for a man from Tarsus named Saul, for he is praying,

12 and he has seen in a vision a man named Ananias come in and lay his hands on him, so that he might regain his sight." 13 But Ananias answered, "Lord, I have heard from many about this man, how much harm he did to Your saints at Jerusalem;

14 and here he has authority from the chief priests to bind all who call on Your name."

15 But the Lord said to him, "Go, for he is a chosen instrument of Mine, to bear My name before the Gentiles and kings and the sons of Israel; 16 for I will show him how much he must suffer for My name's sake."

Acts 26:16 'But get up and stand on your feet; for this purpose I have appeared to you, to appoint you a minister and a witness not only to the things which you have seen, but also to the things in which I will appear to you; 17 rescuing you from the Jewish people and from the Gentiles, to whom I am sending you, 18 to open their eyes so that they may turn from darkness to light and from the dominion of Satan to God, that they may receive forgiveness of sins and an inheritance among those who have been sanctified by faith in Me.'

<u>John 17:17</u> "Sanctify them in the truth; **Your word is truth**.

<u>2 Tim. 3:16</u> All Scripture is inspired by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, for training in righteousness;

<u>2 Pet. 1:20, 21</u> But know this first of all, that no prophecy of Scripture is *a matter* of one's own interpretation,

<u>21</u> for no prophecy was ever made by an act of human will, **but men moved by the Holy Spirit spoke from God.**

Matt. 24:35 "Heaven and earth will pass away, but My words will not pass away.
