<u>Matt. 12:1</u> ¶ At that time Jesus went through the grainfields on the Sabbath, and His disciples became hungry and began to pick the heads of grain and eat.

Gen. 2:3 Then God blessed the seventh day and sanctified it, because in it He rested from all His work which God had created and made.

**Ex. 20:8, 11 8** ¶ "**Remember the sabbath day**, to keep it holy. **11** "For in six days the LORD made the heavens and the earth, the sea and all that is in them, and rested on the seventh day; therefore the LORD blessed **the sabbath** day and made it holy.

**Ex. 31:14-16** 14 'Therefore you are to observe the sabbath, for it is holy to you. Everyone who profanes it shall surely be put to death; for whoever does any work on it, that person shall be cut off from among his people. <u>15</u> 'For six days work may be done, but on the seventh day there is a sabbath of complete rest, holy to the LORD; whoever does any work on the sabbath day shall surely be put to death. <u>16</u> 'So the sons of Israel shall observe the sabbath, to celebrate the sabbath throughout their generations as a perpetual covenant.'

<u>Matt. 12:2</u> But when the Pharisees saw *this*, they said to Him, "Look, Your disciples do what is **not lawful to do on a Sabbath**."

<u>Luke 6:1b</u>  $\P$  Now it happened that He was passing through *some* grainfields on a Sabbath; and His disciples were picking the heads of grain, **rubbing them in their hands**, and eating *the grain*.

<u>Matt. 12:3, 4</u> <u>3</u> But He said to them, "Have you not read what David did when he became hungry, he and his companions <u>4</u> how he entered the house of God, and they ate the consecrated bread, which was not lawful for him to eat nor for those with him, but for the priests alone?

<u>**1** Sam. 21:3-6</u> <u>3</u> "Now therefore, what do you have on hand? Give me five loaves of bread, or whatever can be found." <u>4</u> The **priest answered David** and said, "There is no ordinary bread on hand, but **there is consecrated bread**; if only the young men have kept themselves from women."

<u>**1** Sam. 21:5</u> David answered the priest and said to him, "Surely women have been kept from us as previously when I set out and the vessels of the young men were holy, though it was an ordinary journey; how much more then today will their vessels *be holy?*" <u>**6**</u> So **the priest gave him consecrated** *bread*; for there was no bread there but **the bread of the Presence** which **was removed from before the LORD**, **in order to put hot bread** *in its place* when it was taken away.

<u>Mark 2:26</u> how he entered the house of God in the time of Abiathar *the* high priest, and ate the consecrated bread, which is not lawful for *anyone* to eat except the priests, and he also gave it to those who were with him?"

John 14:26 "But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name, He will teach you all things, and bring to your remembrance all that I said to you.
