<u>**1** Cor. 3:1, 2</u> \prod And I, brethren, could not speak to you as to spiritual men, but as to men of flesh, as to infants in Christ.

<u>Heb. 5:12, 13</u> 12 For though by this time you ought to be teachers, you have need again for someone to teach you the elementary principles of the oracles of God, and you have come to need **milk and not solid food**. <u>13</u> For everyone who partakes *only* of **milk** is not accustomed to the word of righteousness, for he is an infant.

<u>2 Cor. 5:17</u> Therefore if anyone is **in Christ**, *he is* **a new creature**; the old things passed away; behold, new things have come.

Eph. 4:24 and put on the **new self**, which in *the likeness of* God has been **created in righteousness and holiness of the truth.**

<u>2</u> I gave you **milk to drink, not solid food**; for you were not yet able *to receive it*. Indeed, **even now you are not yet able**,

<u>1 Pet. 2:2</u> like **newborn babies, long for the pure milk** of the word, so that by it you may grow in respect to salvation,

<u>1 Cor. 3:3, 4</u> for you are **still fleshly**. For since there is **jealousy and strife** among you, are you not fleshly, and are you not **walking like mere men**?

<u>4</u> For when one says, "I am of Paul," and another, "I am of Apollos," are you not *mere* men?

<u>**Cor. 3:5-9**</u> ¶ What then is Apollos? And what is Paul? **Servants through whom you believed**, even as the Lord gave *opportunity* to each one.

6 I planted, Apollos watered, but God was causing the growth.

<u>7</u> So then neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, **but God who causes the growth.**

<u>8</u> Now he who plants and he who waters **are one**; but **each will receive his own reward** according to **his own labor**.

<u>9</u> For we are God's **fellow workers**; you are **God's field**, God's **building**.
