
The Book of Romans was written from Corinth near the close of Paul's Third Missionary Journey.

I. THE CHURCH AT ROME WAS AN INTEGRATED CHURCH

- A. Of Both Jews And Gentile Believers
 - 1. Gentiles, Rom. 1:13, 15, 16
 - 2. Jews, Rom. 2:17, 23, 24; 7:1
- B. The Letter To The Church At Rome Was Written Around, 57-58 A. D.
- C. It Was Written From Corinth at The Close Of Paul's Third Missionary Journey.
 - -- This was Paul's Great Document on Salvation
 - 1. God's Plan of Salvation is clearly explained. Chs. 1-6
 - 2. Our Great Salvation is Sealed and Coming Glory Is Manifested. Ch. 8
 - 3. God's Program For Israel is Revealed. Chs. 9-11
 - 4. Because of the Mercies of God being displayed, Proper Christian Living is encouraged, Chs. 12-16.
- D. Rome Was The Capital, Most Important City Of The Roman Empire. –It Was Founded In 753 B.C. In 63 B.C. Rome put its heel on Palestine.
- E. The Church Was Probably Founded By Some Of Those Converted On The Day Of Pentecost.
- F. It Was A Good Church!
 - 1. The Problems were few, Rom. 1:7, 8
 - 2. Chapter 14 Appears to reveal some Judging and treating each other with Contempt was going on among some in the Church.
- II. SOME BELIEVERS ARE WEAK IN FAITH AND SOME ARE STRONG IN FAITH, Rom. 14:1, 2
 - A. The Weak Are To Be Accepted
 - 1. Willing acceptance, v-1a
 - 2. But not to pass judgments on them, v-1b
