Sunday, December 6, 2020 Sermon Scriptures

<u>Acts 20:25-27</u> <u>25</u> \P "And now, behold, I know that all of you, among whom I went about preaching the kingdom, **will no longer see my face**.

<u>26</u> "Therefore, I testify to you this day that **I am innocent of the blood of all men**.

27 "For I did not shrink from declaring to you the whole purpose of God.

<u>Acts 20:28-31</u> <u>28</u> "Be on guard for yourselves and for all the flock, among which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers, to shepherd the church of God which He purchased with His own blood.

<u>John 21:15-17</u> <u>15</u> So when they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon, son of John, do you love Me more than these?" He said to Him, "Yes, Lord; You know that I love You." He said to him, "Tend My lambs." <u>16</u> He said to him again a second time, "Simon, son of John, do you love Me?" He said to Him, "Yes, Lord; You know that I love You." He said to him, "Shepherd My sheep." <u>17</u> He said to him the third time, "Simon, son of John, do you love Me?" Peter was grieved because He said to him the third time, "Do you love Me?" And he said to Him, "Lord, You know all things; You know that I love You." Jesus said to him, "Tend My sheep.

<u>29</u> "I know that after my departure **savage wolves will come in** among you, not sparing the flock;

<u>Matt. 7:15</u> ¶ "Beware of the false prophets, who come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly are ravenous wolves.

<u>**Rev. 2:2**</u> ¶ 'I know your deeds and your toil and perseverance, and that **you cannot** tolerate evil men, and **you put to the test those who call themselves apostles**, and they are not, and **you found them** *to be* false;

<u>Acts 20:30</u> and from **among your own selves men will arise**, speaking **perverse things**, to **draw away** the disciples after them.

<u>**1** Tim. 1:3, 4</u> <u>3</u> ¶ As I urged you upon my departure for Macedonia, remain on at **Ephesus** so that you may **instruct certain men not to teach strange doctrines**, <u>**4**</u> **nor to pay attention to myths and endless genealogies**, which give rise to mere speculation rather than *furthering* the administration of God which is by faith.

<u>Acts 20:31</u> "Therefore **be on the alert**, remembering that **night and day** for a period of **three years** I did not cease to **admonish each one with tears**.

<u>Acts 20:32</u> "And now I commend you to God and to the word of His grace, which is able to build *you* up and to give *you* the inheritance among all those who are sanctified.

<u>1 Cor. 10:13</u> No temptation has overtaken you but such as is common to man; and **God** is faithful, who will not allow you to be tempted beyond what you are able, but with the temptation will provide the way of escape also, so that you will be able to endure it.

<u>**1** John 1:9</u> If we confess our sins, **He is faithful and righteous** to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

<u>1 Thess. 2:13</u> ¶ For this reason we also constantly thank God that when you received the word of God which you heard from us, you accepted *it* not *as* the word of men, **but** *for* **what it really is, the word of God**, which also **performs its work in you** who believe.

<u>Phil. 1:6</u> For *I* am confident of this very thing, that He who began a good work in you will perfect it until the day of Christ Jesus.

Acts 20:33-35 33 "I have coveted no one's silver or gold or clothes.

<u>**1** Cor. 9:11, 14, 18</u> <u>11</u> If we sowed spiritual things in you, is it too much if we reap material things from you? <u>14</u> So also the Lord directed those who proclaim the gospel to get their living from the gospel. <u>18</u> What then is my reward? That, when I preach the gospel, I may offer the gospel without charge, so as not to make full use of my right in the gospel.

<u>Heb. 13:5</u> *Make sure that* your character is free from the love of money, being content with what you have; for He Himself has said, "I WILL NEVER DESERT YOU, NOR WILL I EVER FORSAKE YOU,"

<u>Acts 20:34</u> "You yourselves know that these hands ministered to my *own* needs and to the men who were with me.

<u>Acts 20:35</u> "In everything I showed you that by working hard in this manner you must help the weak and remember the words of the Lord Jesus, that He Himself said, 'It is more blessed to give than to receive.'"

<u>Acts 20:36-38</u> <u>36</u> \P When he had said these things, he knelt down and prayed with them all. <u>37</u> And they *began* to weep aloud and embraced Paul, and repeatedly kissed him,

<u>Acts 20:38</u> grieving especially over the word which he had spoken, that they would not see his face again. And they were accompanying him to the ship.
