<u>Luke 7:36</u> ¶ One of **the Pharisees** asked him to eat with him, and he went into the Pharisee's house and reclined at table.

<u>Luke 7:37, 38</u> 37 And **behold**, a woman of the city, **who was a sinner**, when she learned that he was reclining at table in the Pharisee's house, **brought an alabaster flask of ointment**, 38 and standing behind him at his feet, **weeping**, she began to **wet his feet with her tears** and **wiped them** with the **hair of her head** and **kissed his feet** and anointed them with the ointment.

<u>Luke 7:39</u> Now when **the Pharisee** who had invited him saw this, he **said to himself**, "If **this man were a prophet**, he would have known who and what sort of woman this is who is touching him, for she is a sinner."

<u>Luke 7:40</u> And Jesus answering said to him, "**Simon,** I have something to say to you." And he answered, "Say it, Teacher."

<u>Luke 7:41-43 41</u> ¶ "A certain moneylender had two debtors. One owed five hundred denarii, and the other fifty. <u>42</u> When they could not pay, he cancelled the debt of both. Now which of them will love him more?" <u>43</u> Simon answered, "The one, I suppose, for whom he cancelled the larger debt." And he said to him, "You have judged rightly."

<u>Luke 7:44-46 44</u> Then turning toward the woman he said to Simon, "Do you see this woman? I entered your house; you gave me no water for my feet, but she has wet my feet with her tears and wiped them with her hair. <u>45</u> You gave me no kiss, but from the time I came in she has not ceased to kiss my feet. <u>46</u> You did not anoint my head with oil, but she has anointed my feet with ointment.

<u>Luke 7:47</u> Therefore I tell you, **her sins, which are many, are forgiven**—for she **loved much**. But he who is **forgiven little, loves little**."

<u>Luke 7:48-50</u> 48 And he said to her, "Your sins are forgiven."

<u>Luke 7:49</u> Then those who were at table with him began to say among themselves, "Who is this, who even forgives sins?"

<u>Luke 7:50</u> And he said to the woman, "Your faith has saved you; go in peace."

<u>Luke 8:1-3</u> ¶ Soon afterward he went on through cities and villages, proclaiming and bringing the good news of the kingdom of God. And the twelve were with him,

<u>Luke 8:2</u> and also **some women** who had been healed of evil spirits and infirmities: **Mary, called Magdalene**, from whom seven demons had gone out,

<u>Luke 8:3</u> and **Joanna**, the wife of Chuza, **Herod's household manager**, and **Susanna**, and **many others**, who provided for them **out of their means**.
