Sunday, March 21, 2021 Sermon Scriptures

<u>John 8:12</u> ¶ Then Jesus again spoke to them, saying, "I am the Light of the world; he who follows Me will not walk in the darkness, but will have the Light of life."

John 9:5 "While I am in the world, I am the Light of the world."

Matt. 4:12-17 12 ¶ Now when Jesus heard that John had been taken into custody, He withdrew into Galilee; 13 and leaving Nazareth, He came and settled in Capernaum, which is by the sea, in the region of Zebulun and Naphtali. 14 This was to fulfill what was spoken through Isaiah the prophet: 15 "THE LAND OF ZEBULUN AND THE LAND OF NAPHTALI, BY THE WAY OF THE SEA, BEYOND THE JORDAN, GALILEE OF THE GENTILES — 16 "THE PEOPLE WHO WERE SITTING IN DARKNESS SAW A GREAT LIGHT, AND THOSE WHO WERE SITTING IN THE LAND AND SHADOW OF DEATH, UPON THEM A LIGHT DAWNED." 17 ¶ From that time Jesus began to preach and say, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."

<u>Matt. 5:14-16</u> 14 ¶ "You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden; 15 nor does *anyone* light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on the lampstand, and it gives light to all who are in the house. 16 "Let your light shine before men in such a way that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father who is in heaven.

<u>Phil. 2:14, 15</u> 14 ¶ Do all things without grumbling or disputing; <u>15</u> so that you will prove yourselves to be blameless and innocent, children of God above reproach in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation, among whom you appear as lights in the world,

<u>1 Tim. 2:1</u> ¶ First of all, then, I urge that entreaties *and* prayers, petitions *and* thanksgivings, **be made on behalf of all men**,

<u>Luke 18:1</u> ¶ Now He was telling them a parable to show that at all times they ought to pray and not to lose heart,

<u>Acts 1:8</u> but **you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come** upon you; and you shall be **My witnesses** both **in Jerusalem**, and in all Judea and Samaria, and even to the remotest part of the earth."

Rom. 10:17 So faith *comes* from hearing, and hearing by the word of Christ.

<u>Acts 1:8</u> but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be **My witnesses** both in Jerusalem, and in **all Judea and Samaria**, and even to the **remotest part of the earth**."

- <u>Col. 4:5, 6</u> ¶ Conduct yourselves with wisdom toward outsiders, making the most of the opportunity. <u>6</u> Let your speech always be with grace, *as though* seasoned with salt, so that you will know how you should respond to each person.
- Acts 8:1, 4, 5 1 ¶ Saul was in hearty agreement with putting him to death. ¶ And on that day a great persecution began against the church in Jerusalem, and they were all scattered throughout the regions of Judea and Samaria, except the apostles.
- **<u>4</u>** ¶ Therefore, those who had been scattered went about preaching the word.
- **<u>5</u>** Philip went down to the city of Samaria and *began* proclaiming Christ to them.
- <u>Matt. 28:18-20</u> 18 And Jesus came up and spoke to them, saying, "All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth. 19 "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, 20 teaching them to observe all that I commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age."
- Acts 13:1-5 ¶ Now there were at Antioch, in the church that was *there*, prophets and teachers: Barnabas, and Simeon who was called Niger, and Lucius of Cyrene, and Manaen who had been brought up with Herod the tetrarch, and Saul. 2 While they were ministering to the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, "Set apart for Me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them." 3 Then, when they had fasted and prayed and laid their hands on them, they sent them away. 4 ¶ So, being sent out by the Holy Spirit, they went down to Seleucia and from there they sailed to Cyprus. 5 When they reached Salamis, they began to proclaim the word of God in the synagogues of the Jews; and they also had John as their helper.
- Phil. 4:14-19 14 Nevertheless, you have **done well to share** with me in my affliction. 15 ¶ You yourselves also know, Philippians, that at the first preaching of the gospel, after I left Macedonia, no church shared with me in **the matter of giving and receiving** but you alone; 16 for even in Thessalonica you sent a gift more than once for my needs. 17 Not that I seek the gift itself, but I seek for the profit which increases to your account. 18 But I have received everything in full and have an abundance; I am amply supplied, having received from Epaphroditus what you have sent, a fragrant aroma, an acceptable sacrifice, well-pleasing to God. 19 And my God will supply all your needs according to His riches in glory in Christ Jesus.
