Sunday, March 28, 2021 Sermon Scriptures

<u>John 6:14, 15</u> 14 Therefore when the people saw the sign which He had performed, they said, "This is truly the Prophet who is to come into the world."  $\underline{15}$  ¶ So Jesus, perceiving that they were intending to come and take Him by force to make Him king, withdrew again to the mountain by Himself alone.

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<u>Gal. 4:4</u> But when the fullness of the time came, God sent forth His Son, born of a woman, born under the Law,

John 7:3-8 3 Therefore His brothers said to Him, "Leave here and go into Judea, so that Your disciples also may see Your works which You are doing. 4 "For no one does anything in secret when he himself seeks to be *known* publicly. If You do these things, show Yourself to the world." 5 For not even His brothers were believing in Him.
6 So Jesus said to them, "My time is not yet here, but your time is always opportune.
7 "The world cannot hate you, but it hates Me because I testify of it, that its deeds are evil. 8 "Go up to the feast yourselves; I do not go up to this feast because My time has not yet fully come."

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<u>Isa. 9:6</u> For a child will be born to us, a son will be given to us; And **the government** will rest on **His shoulders**; And His name will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Eternal Father, Prince of Peace.

**Zech. 9:9** Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion! Shout *in triumph*, O daughter of Jerusalem! **Behold, your king is coming to you**; He is just and endowed with salvation, Humble, and mounted on a donkey, Even on a colt, the foal of a donkey.

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Matt. 21:1-6 1 ¶ When they had approached Jerusalem and had come to Bethphage, at the Mount of Olives, then Jesus sent two disciples, 2 saying to them, "Go into the village opposite you, and immediately you will find a donkey tied *there* and a colt with her; untie them and bring them to Me. 3 "If anyone says anything to you, you shall say, 'The Lord has need of them,' and immediately he will send them." 4 This took place to fulfill what was spoken through the prophet: 5 "SAY TO THE DAUGHTER OF ZION, 'BEHOLD YOUR KING IS COMING TO YOU, GENTLE, AND MOUNTED ON A DONKEY, EVEN ON A COLT, THE FOAL OF A BEAST OF BURDEN." 6 The disciples went and did just as Jesus had instructed them,

Matt. 21:8, 9 8 Most of the crowd spread their coats in the road, and others were cutting branches from the trees and spreading them in the road. 9 The crowds going ahead of Him, and those who followed, were shouting, "Hosanna to the Son of David; BLESSED IS HE WHO COMES IN THE NAME OF THE LORD; Hosanna in the highest!"

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Matt. 21:10, 11 10 When He had entered Jerusalem, all the city was stirred, saying, "Who is this?" 11 And the crowds were saying, "This is the prophet Jesus, from Nazareth in Galilee."

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Luke 19:37-40 37 As soon as He was approaching, near the descent of the Mount of Olives, the whole crowd of the disciples began to praise God joyfully with a loud voice for all the miracles which they had seen, 38 shouting: "BLESSED IS THE KING WHO COMES IN THE NAME OF THE LORD; Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!" 39 Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to Him, "Teacher, rebuke Your disciples." 40 But Jesus answered, "I tell you, if these become silent, the stones will cry out!"

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Luke 19:41-44 41 ¶ When He approached *Jerusalem*, He saw the city and wept over it, 42 saying, "If you had known in this day, even you, the things which make for peace! But now they have been hidden from your eyes. 43 "For the days will come upon you when your enemies will throw up a barricade against you, and surround you and hem you in on every side, 44 and they will level you to the ground and your children within you, and they will not leave in you one stone upon another, because you did not recognize the time of your visitation."

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Rev. 19:11-16 11 ¶ And I saw heaven opened, and behold, a white horse, and He who sat on it *is* called Faithful and True, and in righteousness **He judges and wages war.**12 His eyes *are* a flame of fire, and on His head *are* many diadems; and He has a name written *on Him* which no one knows except Himself. 13 He is clothed with a robe dipped in blood, and **His name is called The Word of God**. 14 And the armies which are in heaven, clothed in fine linen, white *and* clean, were following Him on white horses. 15 From His mouth comes a sharp sword, so that with it **He may strike down the nations**, and He will rule them with a rod of iron; and He treads the wine press of the fierce wrath of God, the Almighty. 16 And on His robe and on His thigh He has a name written, "KING OF KINGS, AND LORD OF LORDS."

Rev. 20:4-6 4 ¶ Then I saw thrones, and they sat on them, and judgment was given to them. And I saw the souls of those who had been beheaded because of their testimony of Jesus and because of the word of God, and those who had not worshiped the beast or his image, and had not received the mark on their forehead and on their hand; and they came to life and reigned with Christ for a thousand years. 5 The rest of the dead did not come to life until the thousand years were completed. This is the first resurrection. 6 Blessed and holy is the one who has a part in the first resurrection; over these the second death has no power, but they will be priests of God and of Christ and will reign with Him for a thousand years.

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Matt. 21:18, 19 18 ¶ Now in the morning, when He was returning to the city, He became hungry. 19 Seeing a lone fig tree by the road, He came to it and found nothing on it except leaves only; and He said to it, "No longer shall there ever be *any* fruit from you." And at once the fig tree withered.

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<u>Matt. 26:3-5</u> ¶ Then the **chief priests and the elders of the people** were gathered together in the court of the high priest, named Caiaphas; <u>4</u> and **they plotted together** to seize Jesus by stealth **and kill Him**. <u>5</u> But they were saying, "Not during the festival, otherwise a riot might occur among the people."

<u>Luke 22:3</u> ¶ And **Satan entered into Judas** who was called Iscariot, belonging to the number of the twelve.

<u>Matt. 26:14-16</u> ¶ Then one of the twelve, **named Judas Iscariot**, went to the chief priests

Matt. 26:15 and said, "What are you willing to give me to betray Him to you?" And they weighed out thirty pieces of silver to him.

16 From then on he began looking for a good opportunity to betray Jesus.

<u>Matt. 26:47-50</u> 47 ¶ While He was still speaking, **behold**, **Judas**, one of the twelve, came up accompanied by a large crowd with swords and clubs, *who came* from the chief priests and elders of the people. 48 Now he who was betraying Him gave them a sign, saying, "Whomever I kiss, He is the one; seize Him." 49 Immediately Judas went to Jesus and said, "Hail, Rabbi!" and kissed Him. 50 And Jesus said to him, "Friend, *do* what you have come for." Then they came and laid hands on Jesus and seized Him.

<u>John 18:4-8</u> <u>4</u> So Jesus, knowing all the things that were coming upon Him, went forth and said to them, "Whom do you seek?" <u>5</u> They answered Him, "Jesus the Nazarene." He said to them, "I am *He*." And Judas also, who was betraying Him, was standing with them. <u>6</u> So when He said to them, "I am *He*," they drew back and fell to the ground. <u>7</u> Therefore He again asked them, "Whom do you seek?" And they said, "Jesus the Nazarene." <u>8</u> Jesus answered, "I told you that I am *He*; so if you seek Me, let these go their way,"

<u>John 18:12</u> ¶ So the *Roman* cohort and the commander and the officers of the Jews, arrested Jesus and bound Him,

<u>John 18:13, 14, 24</u> 13 and led Him to Annas first; for he was father-in-law of Caiaphas, who was high priest that year. 14 Now Caiaphas was the one who had advised the Jews that it was expedient for one man to die on behalf of the people.

24 So Annas sent Him bound to Caiaphas the high priest.

Matt. 26:59-68 59 ¶ Now the chief priests and the whole Council kept trying to obtain false testimony against Jesus, so that they might put Him to death. did not find any, even though many false witnesses came forward. But later on two came 61 and said, "This man stated, 'I am able to destroy the temple of God and to forward, rebuild it in three days." **62 The high priest** stood up and said to Him, "Do You not answer? What is it that these men are testifying against You?" **63** But Jesus kept silent. And the high priest said to Him, "I adjure You by the living God, that You tell us whether You are the Christ, the Son of God." 64 Jesus said to him, "You have said it yourself; nevertheless I tell you, hereafter you will see THE SON OF MAN SITTING AT THE RIGHT HAND OF POWER, and COMING ON THE CLOUDS OF 65 ¶ Then the high priest tore his robes and said, "He has blasphemed! What further need do we have of witnesses? Behold, you have now heard the blasphemy; 66 what do you think?" They answered, "He deserves death!" **67** ¶ Then they spat 68 and said. in His face and beat Him with their fists; and others slapped Him, "Prophesy to us, You Christ; who is the one who hit You?"

Mark 15:1-3 1 ¶ Early in the morning the chief priests with the elders and scribes and the whole Council, immediately held a consultation; and binding Jesus, they led Him away and delivered Him to Pilate. 2 Pilate questioned Him, "Are You the King of the Jews?" And He answered him, "It is as you say." 3 The chief priests began to accuse Him harshly.

<u>Luke 23:4</u> Then Pilate said to the chief priests and the crowds, "I find no guilt in this man."

John 18:33-38 33 ¶ Therefore Pilate entered again into the Praetorium, and summoned Jesus and said to Him, "Are You the King of the Jews?" 34 Jesus answered, "Are you saying this on your own initiative, or did others tell you about Me?" 35 Pilate answered, "I am not a Jew, am I? Your own nation and the chief priests delivered You to me; what have You done?" 36 Jesus answered, "My kingdom is not of this world. If My kingdom were of this world, then My servants would be fighting so that I would not be handed over to the Jews; but as it is, My kingdom is not of this realm." 37 Therefore Pilate said to Him, "So You are a king?" Jesus answered, "You say correctly that I am a king. For this I have been born, and for this I have come into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who is of the truth hears My voice."
38 Pilate said to Him, "What is truth?" ¶ And when he had said this, he went out again to the Jews and said to them, "I find no guilt in Him.

Matt. 27:15-20 15 ¶ Now at *the* feast the governor was accustomed to release for the people *any* one prisoner whom they wanted. 16 At that time they were holding a **notorious prisoner**, called Barabbas. 17 So when the people gathered together, Pilate said to them, "Whom do you want me to release for you? Barabbas, or Jesus who is called Christ?"

<u>Matt. 27:18</u> For he knew that because of envy they had handed Him over.  $\underline{19}$  ¶ While he was sitting on the judgment seat, his wife sent him *a message*, saying, "Have nothing to do with that righteous Man; for last night I suffered greatly in a dream because of Him."

Matt. 27:20 But the chief priests and the elders persuaded the crowds to ask for Barabbas and to put Jesus to death.

**John 19:4-11** 4 Pilate came out again and said to them, "Behold, I am bringing Him out to you so that you may know that **I find no guilt in Him**." 5 Jesus then came out, wearing the crown of thorns and the purple robe. *Pilate* said to them, "Behold, the Man!" 6 So when the chief priests and the officers saw Him, they cried out saying, "Crucify, crucify!" Pilate said to them, "Take Him yourselves and crucify Him, for I find no guilt in Him." 7 The Jews answered him, "We have a law, and by that law He ought to die because **He made Himself out** *to be* **the Son of God.**" 8 ¶ Therefore when Pilate heard this statement, he was even more afraid; **9** and he entered into the Praetorium again and said to Jesus, "Where are You from?" But Jesus gave him no 10 So Pilate said to Him, "You do not speak to me? Do You not know that I have authority to release You, and I have authority to crucify You?" answered, "You would have no authority over Me, unless it had been given you from above; for this reason he who delivered Me to you has the greater sin."

Matt. 27:21-26 21 But the governor said to them, "Which of the two do you want me to release for you?" And they said, "Barabbas." 22 Pilate said to them, "Then what shall I do with Jesus who is called Christ?" They all said, "Crucify Him!" 23 And he said, "Why, what evil has He done?" But they kept shouting all the more, saying, "Crucify Him!" 24 ¶ When Pilate saw that he was accomplishing nothing, but rather that a riot was starting, he took water and washed his hands in front of the crowd, saying, "I am innocent of this Man's blood; see to that yourselves." 25 And all the people said, "His blood shall be on us and on our children!" 26 Then he released Barabbas for them; but after having Jesus scourged, he handed Him over to be crucified.

Acts 2:22, 23, 36 22 ¶ "Men of Israel, listen to these words: Jesus the Nazarene, a man attested to you by God with miracles and wonders and signs which God performed through Him in your midst, just as you yourselves know —23 this Man, delivered over by the predetermined plan and foreknowledge of God, you nailed to a cross by the hands of godless men and put Him to death. 36 ¶ "Therefore let all the house of Israel know for certain that God has made Him both Lord and Christ — this Jesus whom you crucified."

<u>Matt. 27:31</u> After they had mocked Him, they took the *scarlet* robe off Him and put His *own* garments back on Him, and **led Him away to crucify Him**.

- Matt. 27:45, 46 45 ¶ Now from the sixth hour darkness fell upon all the land until the ninth hour. 46 About the ninth hour Jesus cried out with a loud voice, saying, "ELI, ELI, LAMA SABACHTHANI?" that is, "MY GOD, MY GOD, WHY HAVE YOU FORSAKEN ME?"
- Mark 15:37-39 37 And Jesus uttered a loud cry, and breathed His last. 38 And the veil of the temple was torn in two from top to bottom. 39 When the centurion, who was standing right in front of Him, saw the way He breathed His last, he said, "Truly this man was the Son of God!"
- <u>Luke 23:46</u> And Jesus, crying out with a loud voice, said, "Father, INTO YOUR HANDS I COMMIT MY SPIRIT." Having said this, He breathed His last.
- <u>Isa. 53:4</u> ¶ Surely our griefs He Himself bore, And our sorrows He carried; Yet we ourselves esteemed Him stricken, Smitten of God, and afflicted.
- <u>5</u> But He was **pierced through for our transgressions**, He was crushed for **our iniquities**; The chastening for our well-being *fell* upon Him, And by His scourging we are healed.
- <u>6</u> All of us like sheep have gone astray, Each of us has turned to his own way; But the LORD has caused the iniquity of us all To fall on Him.
- $\underline{10}$  ¶ But the LORD was pleased **To crush Him, putting Him to grief**; If He would render Himself *as* a guilt offering, He will see *His* offspring, He will prolong *His* days, And the good pleasure of the LORD will prosper in His hand.
- <u>11</u> As a result of the anguish of His soul, **He will see** *it and* **be satisfied**; By His knowledge the Righteous One, My Servant, **will justify the many**, As **He will bear their iniquities**.
- <u>12</u> Therefore, I will allot Him a portion with the great, And He will divide the booty with the strong; Because He poured out Himself to death, And was numbered with the transgressors; **Yet He Himself bore the sin of many, And interceded for the transgressors.**
