Ephesus (/Efesoß Ephesos). The most important city in the Roman province of Asia, Ephesus was an international seaport on the west coast of Asia Minor. It was famous for its temple to the Greek goddess Artemis (Roman: Diana), which ranked among the Seven Wonders of the ancient world. Paul visited Ephesus briefly during his second missionary journey (Acts 18:19-21) and left Priscilla and Aquila there. Ephesus was later visited by Apollos (Acts 18:24-26). Paul stayed there extensively during his third missionary journey (Acts 19:1-41). Eventually, his teaching became a threat to the craftsman whose livelihood depended on the worship of Artemis, and a great riot broke out in the city (Acts 19:23-41). Paul later wrote epistles to the church at Ephesus (Ephesians 1:1) and to Timothy, whom he had left at Ephesus (1 Timothy 1:3). The church at Ephesus was one of the seven churches addressed in the book of Revelation (Revelation 1:11; 2:1). (Bible Lands Photo Guide 4-Accordance Bible)
