## **Sermon Outline**

- 4. Paul warns the Gentiles not to become arrogant because of God's favor toward them v-18, 19
- 5. Paul explains that Israel was broken off because of their unbelief, v-20a
- 6. Paul also affirms that the Gentiles stand by their faith, and should not be conceited but to fear, v-20b
- 7. Paul warns that if God did not spare the natural branches in judgment He would not spare the Gentiles either, v-21
- E. Paul Explains That God Is Both A God Of Kindness And Severity, v-22
  - 1. He executed severity on unbelieving Israel, v-22a
  - 2. He executed kindness to believing Gentiles, v-22b
  - 3. Paul warns that the Gentiles must continue in God's kindness unless they too experience His severity, v-22c
- F. Paul Reveals That God Will Graft Israel Back Into His Tree Of Favor, v-23, 24
  - 1. If they do not continue in unbelief, v-23a
  - 2. God is able to do so, v-23b
  - 3. If God grafted the Gentiles in He can graft back in the natural branches, v-24
- F. Paul Also Explains Clearly God's Full Plan For Israel, v-25-29
  - 1. He wanted the Gentiles to know God's secrets, v-25a

- 2. God didn't want the Gentiles to be wise in their own estimation, v-25b
- 3. God has done a partial hardening of Israel until He finishes saving the Gentiles, v-25c
- 4. Then God will restore Israel to Himself, v-26, 27
  - a. He will send Christ back, v-26
  - b. He will take away their sins with the New covenant, v-27; Jer. 31:31; Lk. 22:20; Heb. 8:10
- 5. God's Perspective is two fold for Israel
  - a. From the Gospel standpoint they are enemies for the sake of the Gentiles, v-28a
  - b. From the standpoint of Election they are beloved for the sake of the Fathers v-28b
  - c. The Election of God is irrevocable, 29
- G. God Has Expressed Himself As A God Of Mercy, v-30-32
  - 1. He showed His mercy to the Gentiles at the time of Israel's disobedience, v-30
  - 2. Because God showed His mercy to the disobedient Gentiles, He will show His mercy to disobedient Israel also, v-31
  - 3. God counted both Jews and Gentiles as disobedient so that He might have mercy on both, v-32
