Sunday, June 19, 2022 Sermon Scriptures

1 Cor. 16:13 ¶ Be on the alert, stand firm in the faith, act like men, be strong.

<u>Matt. 16:26</u> "For what will it profit a man if he gains the whole world and forfeits his soul? Or what will a man give in exchange for his soul?

<u>1 Tim. 1:15</u> It is a trustworthy statement, deserving full acceptance, that **Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners,** among whom I am foremost *of all*.

<u>Acts 4:10</u> let it be known to all of you and to all the people of Israel, that by the name of **Jesus Christ** the Nazarene, whom **you crucified, whom God raised from the dead**—by this *name* this man stands here before you in good health.

Acts 4:12 "And there is salvation in no one else; for there is no other name under heaven that has been given among men by which we must be saved."

<u>2 Cor. 6:1, 2</u> ¶ And working together with Him, we also **urge you not to receive the grace of God in vain** — <u>2</u> for He says, "AT THE ACCEPTABLE TIME I LISTENED TO YOU, AND ON THE DAY OF SALVATION I HELPED YOU." Behold, **now is "THE ACCEPTABLE TIME**," behold, **now is "THE DAY OF SALVATION"** —

<u>Psa. 103:13</u> Just as a father has compassion on *his* children, So the LORD has compassion on those who fear Him.

Eph. 5:25 ¶ Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ also loved the church and gave Himself up for her,

<u>1 Cor. 11:3</u> But I want you to understand that **Christ is the head of every man**, and the **man is the head of a woman**, and God is the head of Christ.

<u>1 Cor. 11:7, 8</u> 7 For a man ought not to have his head covered, since he is the image and glory of God; but **the woman is the glory of man**. <u>8</u> For **man does not originate** from woman, but **woman from man**;

<u>1 Tim. 3:1-7</u> ¶ It is a trustworthy statement: if any man aspires to **the office of overseer**, it is a fine work he desires *to do*. <u>2</u> An overseer, then, **must be above** reproach, the husband of one wife, temperate, prudent, respectable, hospitable, able to teach.

- <u>1 Tim. 3:3</u> not addicted to wine or pugnacious, but gentle, peaceable, free from the love of money. <u>4</u> *He must be* one who manages his own household well, keeping his children under control with all dignity <u>5</u> (but if a man does not know how to manage his own household, how will he take care of the church of God?), <u>6</u> *and* not a new convert, so that he will not become conceited and fall into the condemnation incurred by the devil. <u>7</u> And he must have a good reputation with those outside *the church*, so that he will not fall into reproach and the snare of the devil.
- <u>1 Tim. 5:17</u> ¶ The elders who rule well are to be considered worthy of double honor, especially those who work hard at preaching and teaching.
- <u>1 Tim. 3:8-13</u> 8 ¶ Deacons likewise *must be* men of dignity, not double-tongued, or addicted to much wine or fond of sordid gain, $\underline{9}$ *but* holding to the mystery of the faith with a clear conscience. $\underline{10}$ These men must also first be tested; then let them serve as deacons if they are beyond reproach.
- <u>1 Tim. 3:11</u> Women *must* likewise *be* dignified, not malicious gossips, but temperate, faithful in all things.
- <u>12</u> **Deacons** must be husbands of *only* one wife, *and* good managers of *their* children and their own households. <u>13</u> For those who have served well as deacons obtain for themselves a high standing and great confidence in the faith that is in Christ Jesus.
- Gal. 5:22, 23 22 But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, 23 gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law.
- <u>1 Tim. 2:8</u> ¶ Therefore I want **the men** in every place **to pray**, lifting up **holy hands**, without wrath and dissension.

- Phil. 1:20, 21 20 according to my earnest expectation and hope, that I will not be put to shame in anything, but that with all boldness, Christ will even now, as always, be exalted in my body, whether by life or by death.
 21 For to me, to live is Christ and to die is gain.
- <u>1 Tim. 6:, 12</u> <u>11</u> But flee from these things, you man of God, and pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, perseverance *and* gentleness. <u>12</u> Fight the good fight of faith; take hold of the eternal life to which you were called, and you made the good confession in the presence of many witnesses.

<u>Luke 15:17</u> "But when he came to his senses, he said, 'How many of my father's hired men have more than enough bread, but I am dying here with hunger!

<u>Job 1:4, 5</u> <u>4</u> His sons used to go and hold a feast in the house of each one on his day, and they would send and invite their three sisters to eat and drink with them. <u>5</u> When the days of feasting had completed their cycle, **Job would send and consecrate them**, rising up early in the morning and **offering burnt offerings** according to the number of them all; for Job said, "Perhaps my sons have sinned and cursed God in their hearts." **Thus Job did continually**.

<u>Eph. 6:4</u> ¶ Fathers, do not provoke your children to anger, but bring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord.

Josh. 24:14, 15 14 ¶ "Now, therefore, fear the LORD and serve Him in sincerity and truth; and put away the gods which your fathers served beyond the River and in Egypt, and serve the LORD. 15 "If it is disagreeable in your sight to serve the LORD, choose for yourselves today whom you will serve: whether the gods which your fathers served which were beyond the River, or the gods of the Amorites in whose land you are living; but as for me and my house, we will serve the LORD."

Eph. 5:28, 33 28 So husbands ought also to love their own wives as their own bodies. He who loves his own wife loves himself; 33 Nevertheless, each individual

among you also is to **love his own wife even as himself**, and the wife must *see to it* that she respects her husband.

<u>Col. 3:19</u> Husbands, love your wives and do not be embittered against them.

<u>1 Pet. 3:7</u> ¶ You husbands in the same way, live with *your wives* in an understanding way, as with someone weaker, since she is a woman; and show her honor as a fellow heir of the grace of life, so that your prayers will not be hindered.
