
Pergamum (Pe÷rgamoß *Pergamos*). A city of the Roman province of Asia, situated atop a **steep acropolis** overlooking the Caicus River. Originally founded by Spartan colonists in the 5th century BC, Pergamum became the center of an expanding Hellenistic kingdom during the 2nd and 3rd centuries BC. . . . Pergamum attained a high degree of **artistic and intelectual culture**, **boasting a library which rivaled that of Alexandria**, **magnificent public buildings**, and a famous school of sculpture which produced such remarkable works as *The Dying Gaul*.

... When Attalus III of Pergamum died without an heir, he bequeathed the territories under his control to Rome. These lands then formed much of the new Roman province of Asia.
