Sunday, October 9, 2022 Sermon Scriptures

<u>Acts 26:17, 18</u> 17 rescuing you from the *Jewish* people and from the Gentiles, to whom I am sending you, <u>18</u> to open their eyes so that they may turn from darkness to light and from the dominion of Satan to God, that they may receive forgiveness of sins and an inheritance among those who have been sanctified by faith in Me.'

<u>Acts 4:12</u> "And there is salvation in no one else; for there is no other name under heaven that has been given among men by which we must be saved."

Eph. 4:32 Be kind to one another, **tender-hearted**, **forgiving each other**, just as God in Christ also has forgiven you.

<u>Col. 3:13</u> bearing with one another, and forgiving each other, whoever has a complaint against anyone; just as the Lord forgave you, so also should you.

<u>Mark 11:25</u> "Whenever you stand praying, forgive, if you have anything against anyone, so that your Father who is in heaven will also forgive you your transgressions.

<u>Matt. 6:15</u> "But if you do not forgive others, then your Father will not forgive your transgressions.

<u>Matt. 6:14</u> "For if you forgive others for their transgressions, your heavenly Father will also forgive you.

<u>Luke 6:37</u> ¶ "Do not judge, and you will not be judged; and do not condemn, and you will not be condemned; **pardon, and you will be pardoned.**

Matt. 18:21, 22 21 ¶ Then Peter came and said to Him, "Lord, how often shall my brother sin against me and I forgive him? Up to seven times?" 22 Jesus said to him, "I do not say to you, up to seven times, but up to seventy times seven.

<u>Luke 17:3, 4</u> "Be on your guard! If your brother sins, rebuke him; and if he repents, forgive him. <u>4</u> "And if he sins against you seven times a day, and returns to you seven times, saying, 'I repent,' forgive him."

<u>Luke 23:34</u> But Jesus was saying, "Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing." And they cast lots, dividing up His garments among themselves.

<u>Acts 7:59, 60</u> <u>59</u> They went on stoning Stephen as he called on *the Lord* and said, "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit!"

<u>Acts 7:60</u> Then falling on his knees, he cried out with a loud voice, "Lord, do not hold this sin against them!" Having said this, he fell asleep.

<u>Philem. 1</u> ¶ Paul, a prisoner of Christ Jesus, and Timothy our brother, ¶ To Philemon our beloved *brother* and fellow worker,

<u>Philem. 2</u> and to **Apphia our sister**, and to **Archippus our fellow soldier**, and to the **church in your house**:

<u>Philem. 3-5</u> <u>3</u> Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. <u>4</u>¶ I thank my God always, making mention of you in my prayers, <u>5</u> because I hear of your love and of the faith which you have toward the Lord Jesus and toward all the saints;

<u>Eph. 6:5</u> ¶ Slaves, be obedient to those who are your masters according to the flesh, with fear and trembling, in the sincerity of your heart, as to Christ;

<u>Philem. 8</u> ¶ Therefore, though I have **enough confidence in Christ to order you** *to do* what is proper,

<u>Philem. 9</u> yet **for love's sake I rather appeal** *to you* — since I am such a person as Paul, the aged, and now also a prisoner of Christ Jesus —

<u>Philem. 10</u> I appeal to you for my child Onesimus, whom I have begotten in my imprisonment,

Philem. 11 who **formerly was useless** to you, but **now is useful** both to you and to me.

Philem. 12 I have sent him back to you in person, that is, sending my very heart,

<u>Philem. 13</u> whom I wished to keep with me, so that on your behalf he might minister to me in my imprisonment for the gospel;

<u>Philem. 14</u> but without your consent I did not want to do anything, so that your goodness would not be, in effect, by compulsion **but of your own free will**.

<u>Philem. 15, 16</u> <u>15</u> For perhaps he was for this reason separated *from you* for a while, that you would have him back forever, <u>16</u> no longer as a slave, but more than a slave, a beloved brother, especially to me, but how much more to you, both in the flesh and in the Lord.

Philem. 17, 18 17 ¶ If then you regard me a partner, **accept him as** *you would* **me**.

Philem. 18, 19 18 But if he has wronged you in any way or owes you anything, charge that to my account; 19 I, Paul, am writing this with my own hand, I will repay it (not to mention to you that you owe to me even your own self as well).

<u>Philem. 20</u> Yes, brother, let me benefit from you in the Lord; refresh my heart in Christ.

<u>Philem. 7</u> For I have come to have much joy and comfort in your love, because the hearts of the saints have been refreshed through you, brother.

<u>Philem. 21</u> ¶ Having confidence in your obedience, I write to you, since I know that you will do even more than what I say.
