Sermon Scriptures

Matt. 16:21 ¶ From that time Jesus began to show His disciples that He must go to Jerusalem, and suffer many things from the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and be raised up on the third day.

<u>Luke 9:28</u> ¶ Some eight days after these sayings, He took along Peter and John and James, and went up on the mountain to pray.

 $\underline{\text{Matt. 16:28}}$ ¶ "Truly I say to you, there are some of those who are standing here who will not taste death until they see the Son of Man coming in His kingdom."

<u>Matt. 16:22</u> Peter took Him aside and began to rebuke Him, saying, "God forbid *it,* Lord! This shall never happen to You."

Matt. 16:23 But He turned and said to Peter, "Get behind Me, Satan! You are a stumbling block to Me; for you are not setting your mind on God's interests, but man's."

Matt. 16:24-28 24 ¶ Then Jesus said to His disciples, "If anyone wishes to come after Me, he must deny himself, and take up his cross and follow Me. 25 "For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it; but whoever loses his life for My sake will find it. 26 "For what will it profit a man if he gains the whole world and forfeits his soul? Or what will a man give in exchange for his soul? 27 "For the Son of Man is going to come in the glory of His Father with His angels, and WILL THEN REPAY EVERY MAN ACCORDING TO HIS DEEDS. 28 ¶ "Truly I say to you, there are some of those who are standing here who will not taste death until they see the Son of Man coming in His kingdom."

<u>Luke 9:28b</u> ¶ Some eight days after these sayings, He took along Peter and John and James, and went up on the mountain to pray.

<u>Luke 9:29a</u> And while He was praying, the appearance of His face became different, and His clothing *became* white *and* gleaming.

Matt. 17:2 And He was transfigured before them; and His face shone like the sun, and His garments became as white as light.

<u>Mark 9:3</u> and His garments became radiant and exceedingly white, as no launderer on earth can whiten them.

<u>Luke 9:29b</u> And while He was praying, the appearance of His face became different, and **His clothing** *became* white *and* **gleaming**.

<u>Luke 9:32</u> Now Peter and his companions had been overcome with sleep; but when they were fully awake, they saw His glory and the two men standing with Him.

Matt. 17:3 And behold, Moses and Elijah appeared to them, talking with Him.

<u>Luke 9:31b</u> who, appearing in glory, were speaking of His departure which He was about to accomplish at Jerusalem.

Matt. 17:4 Peter said to Jesus, "Lord, it is good for us to be here; if You wish, I will make three tabernacles here, one for You, and one for Moses, and one for Elijah."

Mark 9:5 Peter said to Jesus, "Rabbi, it is good for us to be here; let us make three tabernacles, one for You, and one for Moses, and one for Elijah."

<u>Luke 9:33</u> And as these were leaving Him, Peter said to Jesus, "Master, it is good for us to be here; let us make three tabernacles: one for You, and one for Moses, and one for Elijah" — not realizing what he was saying.

Matt. 17:5a While he was still speaking, a bright cloud overshadowed them, and behold, a voice out of the cloud said, "This is My beloved Son, with whom I am well-pleased; listen to Him!"

<u>Mark 9:7</u> Then a cloud formed, overshadowing them, and a voice came out of the cloud, "This is My beloved Son, listen to Him!"

<u>Matt. 3:17</u> and behold, a voice out of the heavens said, "This is My beloved Son, in whom I am well-pleased."

<u>Matt. 17:5c</u> While he was still speaking, a bright cloud overshadowed them, and behold, a voice out of the cloud said, "This is My beloved Son, with whom I am well-pleased; **listen to Him!**"

Matt. 17:6 When the disciples heard *this*, they fell face down to the ground and were terrified.

Matt. 17:7, 8 7 And Jesus came to them and touched them and said, "Get up, and do not be afraid." 8 And lifting up their eyes, they saw no one except Jesus Himself alone.

Matt. 17:9 ¶ As they were coming down from the mountain, Jesus commanded them, saying, "Tell the vision to no one until the Son of Man has risen from the dead."

Mark 9:10 They seized upon that statement, discussing with one another what rising from the dead meant.

Matt. 17:10 And His disciples asked Him, "Why then do the scribes say that Elijah must come first?"

Matt. 17:11 And He answered and said, "Elijah is coming and will restore all things;

Matt. 17:12 but I say to you that Elijah already came, and they did not recognize him, but did to him whatever they wished. So also the Son of Man is going to suffer at their hands."

<u>Mark 9:12</u> And He said to them, "Elijah does first come and restore all things. And *yet* how is it written of the Son of Man that He will suffer many things and be treated with contempt?

Matt. 17:13 Then the disciples understood that He had spoken to them about John the Baptist.
