Sunday, June 15, 2025 Sermon Scriptures

Luke 16:25-29 25 "But Abraham said, 'Child, remember that during your life you received your good things, and likewise Lazarus bad things; but now he is being comforted here, and you are in agony. 26 'And besides all this, between us and you there is a great chasm fixed, so that those who wish to come over from here to you will not be able, and that none may cross over from there to us.' 27 "And he said, 'Then I beg you, father, that you send him to my father's house — 28 for I have five brothers — in order that he may warn them, so that they will not also come to this place of torment.' 29 "But Abraham said, 'They have Moses and the Prophets; let them hear them.'

Acts 7:51, 52 51 ¶ "You men who are stiff-necked and uncircumcised in heart and ears are always resisting the Holy Spirit; you are doing just as your fathers did. 52 "Which one of the prophets did your fathers not persecute? They killed those who had previously announced the coming of the Righteous One, whose betrayers and murderers you have now become;

<u>Luke 15:16-24</u> 16 "And he would have gladly filled his stomach with the pods that the swine were eating, and no one was giving *anything* to him. 17 "But when he came to his senses, he said, 'How many of my father's hired men have more than enough bread, but I am dying here with hunger! 18 'I will get up and go to my father, and will say to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven, and in your sight; longer worthy to be called your son; make me as one of your hired men." got up and came to his father. But while he was still a long way off, his father saw him and felt compassion for him, and ran and embraced him and kissed him. the son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and in your sight; I am no longer worthy to be called your son.' 22 "But the father said to his slaves, 'Quickly bring out the best robe and put it on him, and put a ring on his hand and sandals on his 23 and bring the fattened calf, kill it, and let us eat and celebrate; son of mine was dead and has come to life again; he was lost and has been found.' And they began to celebrate.

<u>Gen. 6:8, 9</u> 8 But Noah found favor in the eyes of the LORD. 9 These are the records of the generations of Noah. Noah was a righteous man, blameless in his time; Noah walked with God.

<u>Gen. 7:1, 5</u> 1 ¶ Then the LORD said to Noah, "Enter the ark, you and all your household, for you *alone* I have seen *to be* righteous before Me in this time. 5 Noah did according to all that the LORD had commanded him.

- Job 1:1, 2, 4, 5 1 ¶ There was a man in the land of Uz whose name was Job; and that man was blameless, upright, fearing God and turning away from evil. 2 Seven sons and three daughters were born to him. 4 His sons used to go and hold a feast in the house of each one on his day, and they would send and invite their three sisters to eat and drink with them. 5 When the days of feasting had completed their cycle, Job would send and consecrate them, rising up early in the morning and offering burnt offerings according to the number of them all; for Job said, "Perhaps my sons have sinned and cursed God in their hearts." Thus Job did continually.
- <u>1 Tim. 2:3-5</u> <u>3</u> This is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Savior, <u>4</u> who desires all men to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth.
- <u>5</u> For there is **one God**, *and* **one mediator** also between God and men, *the* man Christ Jesus,
- Gen. 5:21-24 21 ¶ And Enoch lived sixty-five years, and became the father of Methuselah. 22 Then Enoch walked with God three hundred years after he became the father of Methuselah, and he had *other* sons and daughters. 23 So all the days of Enoch were three hundred and sixty-five years. 24 And Enoch walked with God; and he was not, for God took him.
- <u>Heb. 11:5</u> By faith **Enoch** was taken up so that he would not see death; **AND HE WAS NOT FOUND BECAUSE GOD TOOK HIM UP**; for he obtained the witness that before his being taken up **he was pleasing to God**.

Gen. 5:25-27 25 ¶ And Methuselah lived one hundred and eighty-seven years, and became the father of Lamech. 26 Then Methuselah lived seven hundred and eighty-two years after he became the father of Lamech, and he had *other* sons and daughters. 27 So all the days of Methuselah were nine hundred and sixty-nine years, and he died.

Gen, 5:28-31 28 ¶ And Lamech lived one hundred and eighty-two years, and became the father of a son. 29 Now he called his name Noah, saying, "This one shall give us rest from our work and from the toil of our hands *arising* from the ground which the LORD has cursed." 30 Then Lamech lived five hundred and ninety-five years after he became the father of Noah, and he had *other* sons and daughters. 31 So all the days of Lamech were seven hundred and seventy-seven years, and he died.

- Gen. 6:8, 9 8 But Noah found favor in the eyes of the LORD.
- Gen. 7:1 ¶ Then the LORD said to Noah, "Enter the ark, you and all your household; for you alone I have seen to be righteous before Me in this time.
- **Gen. 6:9** ¶ These are *the records of* the generations of Noah. Noah was a righteous man, blameless in his time; **Noah walked with God**.

- **Gen. 7:5** And Noah did according to all that the LORD had commanded him.
- Gen. 6:5-7 5 ¶ Then the LORD saw that the wickedness of man was great on the earth, and that every intent of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually. 6 And the LORD was sorry that He had made man on the earth, and He was grieved in His heart. 7 And the LORD said, "I will blot out man whom I have created from the face of the land, from man to animals to creeping things and to birds of the sky; for I am sorry that I have made them."
- Gen. 6:11-13 11 Now the earth was corrupt in the sight of God, and the earth was filled with violence. 12 And God looked on the earth, and behold, it was corrupt; for all flesh had corrupted their way upon the earth.
- <u>Gen. 6:13</u> ¶ Then God said to Noah, "The end of all flesh has come before Me; for the earth is filled with violence because of them; and **behold**, **I am about to destroy them with the earth.**
- Gen. 6:17 "And behold, I, even I am bringing the flood of water upon the earth, to destroy all flesh in which is the breath of life, from under heaven; everything that is on the earth shall perish.
- <u>2 Pet. 2:5</u> and did not spare the ancient world, but preserved Noah, a preacher of righteousness, with seven others, when He brought a flood upon the world of the ungodly;
- <u>1 Pet. 3:20</u> who once were disobedient, when the patience of God kept waiting in the days of Noah, during the construction of the ark, in which a few, that is, **eight persons**, were brought safely through *the* water.
- Gen. 8:13-22 13 ¶ Now it came about in the six hundred and first year, in the first *month*, on the first of the month, the water was dried up from the earth. Then Noah removed the covering of the ark, and looked, and behold, the surface of the ground was 14 And in the second month, on the twenty-seventh day of the month, the earth was dry. 15 Then God spoke to Noah, saying, 16 "Go out of the ark, you and your wife and your sons and your sons' wives with you. 17 "Bring out with you every living thing of all flesh that is with you, birds and animals and every creeping thing that creeps on the earth, that they may breed abundantly on the earth, and be fruitful and 18 So Noah went out, and his sons and his wife and his sons' multiply on the earth." wives with him. 19 Every beast, every creeping thing, and every bird, everything that moves on the earth, went out by their families from the ark. 20 ¶ Then Noah built an altar to the LORD, and took of every clean animal and of every clean bird and offered burnt offerings on the altar. 21 And the LORD smelled the soothing aroma; and the LORD said to Himself, "I will never again curse the ground on account of man, for

the intent of man's heart is evil from his youth; and I will never again destroy every living thing, as I have done.

Gen. 8:22 "While the earth remains,

Seedtime and harvest,
And cold and heat,
And summer and winter,
And day and night
Shall not cease."

Ezek. 14:14 even *though* these three men, **Noah**, **Daniel**, and **Job** were in its midst, by their *own* righteousness **they could** *only* **deliver themselves**," declares the Lord GOD. Ezek. 14:20 even *though* **Noah**, **Daniel**, and **Job** were in its midst, as I live," declares the Lord GOD, "they could not deliver either *their* son or *their* daughter. They would deliver only themselves by their righteousness."

Heb. 11:7 By faith Noah, being warned by God about things not yet seen, in reverence prepared an ark for the salvation of his household, by which he condemned the world, and became an heir of the righteousness which is according to faith.

Gen. 6:10 And Noah became the father of three sons: Shem, Ham, and Japheth.

Gen. 5:32 ¶ And Noah was five hundred years old, and Noah became the father of Shem, Ham, and Japheth.

Gen. 6:14-16 14 "Make for yourself an ark of gopher wood; you shall make the ark with rooms, and shall cover it inside and out with pitch.

15 "And this is how you shall make it: the length of the ark three hundred cubits, its breadth fifty cubits, and its height thirty cubits.

16 "You shall make a window for the ark, and finish it to a cubit from the top; and set the door of the ark in the side of it; you shall make it with lower, second, and third decks.

Gen. 7:7 Then Noah and his sons and his wife and his sons' wives with him entered the ark because of the water of the flood.

Gen. 7:10 And it came about after the seven days, that the water of the flood came upon the earth.

Gen. 9:1 ¶ And God blessed Noah and his sons and said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the earth.
